1	Seasons	A time of the year; there are four seasons in a year.
2	Spring	Follows winter; a time when plants start to grow and most animal babies are born.
3	Summer	Follows Spring; the warmest season of the year.
4	Autumn	Follows Summer; leaves start to fall from trees.
5	Winter	Follows Autumn; the coldest season and a time when animals hibernate.
6	Temperature	Temperature is how hot or cold something is.
7	Observe	To look at something very carefully and notice what's happening.
8	Sunrise	The time in the morning when the sun appears.
9	Sunset	The time in the evening when the sun disappears from sight.
10	Day Length	The amount of light we get from the sun in a day.

Key knowledge

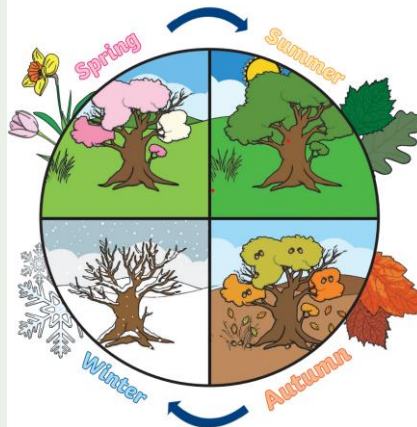
The four seasons are spring, summer, autumn and winter.

The weather changes in each season.

The environment around us changes with each season. For example- the leaves turn brown, orange, red and yellow then fall off the trees.

The day length changes with each season with summer having more hours of daylight than the other seasons.

Order of Seasons



Lighter Mornings and Evenings

In the summer, there are more hours of daylight. This means that it gets lighter earlier in the morning and gets darker later in the evening.
