


















Vocabulary		
armour		A special protective covering, made from strong materials like metal or leather, used to keep safe.
army		A large, organised group of soldiers trained to protect their country or land.
artefact		An object made by a human that gives clues about the past e.g. tools, clothing, pottery or buildings.
battle		A serious fight or struggle between two or more groups of people, often soldiers.
battlefield		The place where a battle happens or has happened in the past.
consequence		A direct result of an action. This can be positive or negative.
dynasty		A series of rulers who all come from the same family.
leader		The person who is in charge and is followed by others.
monarch		A ruler of a kingdom or empire, who typically holds their position for life through a royal family.
motive		The reason why someone does something.
soldier		A person who serves in an army to protect their country.
source		A person, place or thing that provides information.
tactic		A planned action or method used to achieve a goal.
weapon		An object used to cause harm or fight against an enemy.

Key people		
	Richard III (Richard 3 <sup>rd</sup> )	Richard III was the king of England for only 2 years in 1483. He became king of England when his brother Edward V died. It was suggested that people did not like him very much. During the Battle of Bosworth his horse was killed. This resulted in his death because he was on foot. In 2012, his body was found buried under a car park in Leicester (which is not where archaeologists originally thought he was buried). You can visit a museum in Leicester that shares information on his life.
	Henry VII (Henry 7 <sup>th</sup> ) (Henry Tudor)	Henry Tudor lived in France. He strongly believed he had a claim to the English throne. He brought an army of 8,000 people to England to attack Richard's army. This was soon followed by Richard's defeat on Bosworth Battlefield. Henry Tudor was crowned Henry VII and the people of England much preferred him as king. He was successful and brought money and business to the country. He died in 1509.

1	2 <sup>nd</sup> October	1483	Richard III became king of England.
2	22 <sup>nd</sup> August	1485	Battle of Bosworth and Richard's death.
3	22 <sup>nd</sup> August	1485	Henry VII took throne.
4	21 <sup>st</sup> April	1509	Henry VII died.
