Key Knowledge

The human life cycle is baby > child > adolescent > adult > elderly.

Humans grow and change in different ways in these stages: physically, emotionally and mentally.

Human growth rate is the fastest during the time humans are infants (0-3 years old) and during puberty.

Gestation is the time when a foetus is growing inside a womb. Different animals have gestation periods of different lengths. Scientists look for patterns in the gestation periods of different animals. They might look at the size or mass of the animals to consider if this has an effect on the length of the gestation period.



prenatal

The cells develop and grow into a foetus inside the female uterus. After about nine months, the baby is born.

infancu

Infants undergo rapid growth and development.

They learn to walk and talk.

childhood

Children learn new skills and become more independent.

adolescence

The body starts to change over a few years. The changes occur to enable reproduction during adulthood.

Adolescents become much more independent.

middle adulthood

The ability to reproduce decreases. There may be hair loss or hair may turn grey.

late adulthood

Leading a healthy lifestyle can help to slow down the decline in fitness and health that occurs during this stage.

early adulthood

The human body is at its peak of fitness and strength.
