1	<b>Animal</b>	A living organism that feeds on organic matter.	1	<b>There are different classifications of animals and humans:</b> Mammals, birds, reptiles, fish, amphibians	
2	<b>Reptiles</b>	Reptiles have dry, scaly skin and most of them lay soft-shelled eggs on land. They are cold blooded.	2	<b>The human body is made up of different parts:</b> Head, neck, arms, elbows, legs, knees, face, ears, eyes, hair, mouth, teeth	
3	<b>Fish</b>	Fish have gills that allow them to breathe underwater. Most fish are covered in scales. Fish have fins which help them to swim.	3	<b>Animals and humans have various diets:</b> Herbivores, carnivores and omnivores.

5	<b>Herbivore</b>	An animal that feeds on plants.	<b>Herbivore</b> A plant or animal that eats plants ONLY.	<b>Carnivore</b> A plant or animal that eats animals ONLY.	<b>Omnivore</b> A plant or animal that eats both plants and animals.
6	<b>Omnivore</b>	An animal that feeds on meat and plants.	  	  	  
7	<b>Birds</b>	An animal that has feathers, wings and lays eggs.			
8	<b>Mammals</b>	Mammals are warm-blooded animals that give birth to live young and have hair or fur			
9	<b>Human body</b>	The human body is made up of various parts that work together to keep us alive.			
	<b>Amphibians</b>	Amphibians are animals that live part of their lives in water and part on land.
