

Year 1 Science Knowledge Organiser – Animals including humans

Vocabulary

1	Animal	A living organism that feeds on organic matter.
2	Reptiles	Reptiles have dry, scaly skin and most of them lay soft-shelled eggs on land. They are cold blooded.
3	Fish	Fish have gills that allow them to breathe underwater. Most fish are covered in scales. Fish have fins which help them to swim.
4	Carnivore	An animal that gets it's food from eating other animals.
5	Herbivore	An animal that feeds on plants.
6	Omnivore	An animal that feeds on meat and plants.
7	Birds	An animal that has feathers, wings and lays eggs.
8	Mammals	Mammals are warm-blooded animals that give birth to live young and have hair or fur
9	Human body Amphibians	The human body is made up of various parts that work together to keep us alive. Amphibians are animals that live part of their lives in water and part on land.
