1	recycle	to make something ready to use again

4	habitat	the place where an animal lives or a plant grows

7	deforestation	when all the trees are cut down or destroyed
8	countryside	land not near towns or cities

What can you do to help the environment?

1	Save water – turn the tap off when you have finished.	
2	Recycle – sort rubbish into the correct bins.	
3	Walk or ride your bike – travelling in the car creates pollution.	
4	Use less power – switch electrical items off when they are not in use.	
5	Reuse – refill your water bottle instead of buying new ones.	
6	Say no to plastic bags – take your own bag when you go shopping.	
7	Reduce rubbish – for example: put food scraps in a compost bin.
