Homework

The expectation is that children in Year 3 will read with an adult daily. This could be fiction, non-fiction, newspapers, comics, recipes or online material.

Reading and exposure to words help children maximize their language, comprehension and concentration skills. It also improves their imagination, creativity and overall mental well-being.

Each term, homework will focus on KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts) and Year 3 spellings, including common exception words.

KIRFs are designed to support the development of the mental skills that underpin much of the maths work in schools. They are particularly useful when calculating; be it adding, subtracting, multiplying or dividing. Common exception words are words that don't follow regular spelling rules.

Homework will be set on a **Friday and due the following **Friday**. The children will be told what tasks they need to complete each week.**
