


I like this story because it teaches us that friendship comes from shared interests. This is a lovely story that all ages will enjoy reading.




#### Mrs Sukennikova's Choice

If you enjoyed the film, **THIS** book is better!






### Mr Vella-Blake's Choice

As the winged ship Aurora sets sail, the twins must keep their wits about them and prove themselves worthy of the rest of the crew.






## Mrs Cumiskay's Choice

If you read this book and like it there are four other books featuring Ottoline and Mr. Munroe.






#### Miss Mehta's Choice

Then something awful happens, and Lucy feels that her life has turned upside-down. Back at home in London, she wonders whether she'll ever see Lob again. Will he come and find her?






## Mrs Hagger's Choice

not, something terrible will befall him...






## Mrs Combey's Choice


Can Ami and her friends find the answer before it's too late?

Lightning Never Strikes Twice, Does It?


The youngest Son in a family of search-and-rescue dog trainers, Luke must face his deathly fear of storms to prove that he and the dog he's training belong in the family business.


#### Mrs Watts' choice

"Just make a mark and see where it takes you."


Have you ever felt that you 'just can't draw'?
